Want a temporary space for your exhibition? You might do as Caryn Kunkle did, pitching Here Not There, her show of three artists (including herself), to a local real estate agency owner (in this case, Allan Domb), who in turn loaned the artists an unoccupied commercial space on the ground floor of the Parc Rittenhouse through August. If you're in the neighborhood, walk east on Locust Street from 18th Street, to an unmarked door just east of Parc Restaurant's south-facing side.

Kunkle is showing an enormous scroll-like drawing she made in collaboration with her brother, and "portraits" painted on target posters. Pete Zebley, a painter, is represented by his oil and enamel-on-aluminum panel visions reminiscent of Interview magazine covers, and Jordan **Griska** by his submarine composed of found parts and his new painted metal "Honorbox" sculptures featuring the front pages of Louisiana newspapers the day after Katrina struck. Here Not There, 225 S. 18th St., entrance on Locust Street. After Sunday, open by appointment and evenings through Friday.
